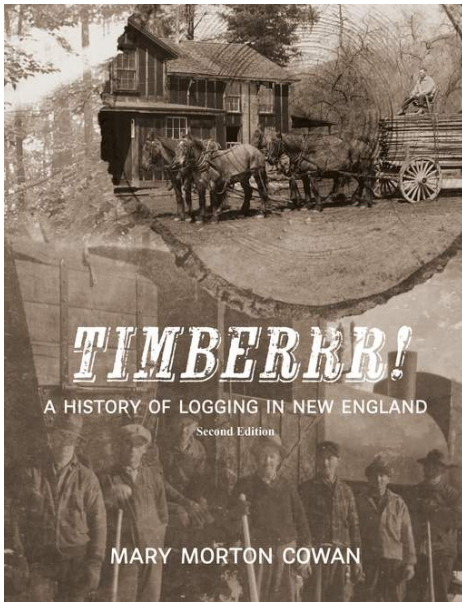


Timberrr! A History of Logging in New England
